

Parker Given Triple Terms After Robbery

Constant Probe at Hospital Urged

Wendell Parker Jr., 23, pleaded guilty Monday in Sedgewick County District Court to charges of robbery, assault against a law enforcement officer and illegal possession of a pistol after a felony conviction.

Parker was sentenced by Judge Howard C. Kline to concurrent sentences of 15 years to life, 5-20 years and 1-10 years, respectively, on the pleas.

Parker admitted robbing Enoch's Market, 1901 N. Waco, Aug. 29, while armed with a .22-caliber revolver. He also admitted driving a car from which a shot was fired at officer John T. Espinosa during a chase.

After a trial last week Judge Kline ruled Mrs. Mildred A. Wick, 60, not guilty by reason of insanity of the shooting deaths of her two adopted sons at the family home on April 10, 1964.

Shortly after the April 10, 1964, incident Mrs. Wick was transferred by court order to Larned State Hospital after it was determined that she was not capable of assisting in her own defense.

In December she was returned to Sedgewick County to stand trial. Attorneys in the case stipulated to the facts and the record in the case and Kline made his ruling on that basis without hearing testimony.

Mrs. Wick was ordered returned to Larned for further treatment.

Doctor's Trial Jury Gets Three Options

MINEOLA, N. Y. (UPI) — The judge in the trial of Dr. Vincent A. Montmarano on charges of killing a cancer patient with an injection ruled Monday he will give the jury only three options — guilty of murder, guilty of attempted murder or acquittal.

Summons by the prosecution and defense and the charge to the jury are scheduled for today.

Fired Teacher Is Cleared Of Marijuana Conviction

LINCOLN, Kan. — Dave Bogart, former Lincoln High School shop teacher, was cleared Monday of a possession of marijuana conviction that prompted the Lincoln school board to fire him last month.

In setting aside the guilty verdict, District Court Judge Marvin O. Brummett said there is a difference between custody and possession of marijuana. Brummett said even though Bogart may have

had custody of marijuana, there was no evidence to show it was in his possession for his own use.

James Mettner, superintendent of schools at Lincoln, said the board was scheduled to meet Monday night but added that the question of Bogart's dismissal was "not on the agenda."

Mettner said he did not know what action the board might take in light of the court decision because the board has hired a replacement shop teacher.
