

Rosenzweig the Abortionist—His Fruitless Attempt to Get Out on Bail.

JACOB ROSENZWEIG, the abortionist doctor, charged with the homicide of the unfortunate Miss BOWLSBY, of Paterson, N. J., was yesterday brought before Judge CARDOZO, of the Supreme Court, on a motion to admit him to bail.

Mr. WILLIAM F. HOWE, who, in company with Mr. ABRAHAM HUMMEL appeared on the prisoner's behalf, moved that the Court fix the amount of bail. Mr. HOWE reviewed at length the testimony as taken before the Coroner, and contended that it failed to show that an abortion was committed; it failed to show the identity of the body found; or, both these being admitted, it failed to show that the deceased was ever alive in the prisoner's house, or that he had operated on her.

District-Attorney GARVIN being about to reply, Judge CARDOZO told him it was unnecessary, and added: "I have no disposition, even if it were proper, to review the testimony against the prisoner at this time. It is enough to say that such a case is presented as to make it improper for me to admit the prisoner to bail at this time. The motion is therefore denied."

The prisoner was then removed, and for the first time in public since his arrest, was the subject of but little curiosity. This doubtless was owing to the fact that next door there was an effort being made to capture higher game, in which the people at large took a deep interest.

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
